Class 1

Side Saddle International Novice Equitation Class (Trophy to Highest placed Area 14 Member)

Open to adult and junior riders who have never competed in a Side Saddle Equitation Qualifying Class. Habits need not be worn and horses may be shared. A short simple show will be required.

Class 2

EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS Inc SIR LANCELOT MEMORIAL TROPHY QUALIFIER

Run under S.S.A. Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to S.S.A. Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for S.S.A. rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and S.S.A. Championship Points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. Side Saddle International offer a rosette to the Adult Member and Manor Grange Stud Show Centre to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out.

Sir Lancelot Qualifier: (The Area 14 Pattie Curtis Memorial Trophy to the winner)

For Shows (maximum of 2 per Area), invited by the relevant S.S.A. Area Chairman, to hold a Sir Lancelot Qualifier • The Judge must be on the current S.S.A. Panel but may be assisted by a Celebrity or Sponsor A Special rosette will be offered to the Adult Member, carrying their current Championship Points Card, of the S.S.A. Area in which the Show is organised, who during the Equitation Qualifier Class (irrespective of final placing) is judged to be the most elegant. That member will be eligible to compete in the Final for the Sir Lancelot Memorial Trophy (donated by the late Mrs E. Skelton) at the National Side Saddle Show. A Member may only qualify once per season between one National Show and the next, and if the Judge's first choice has already qualified, the rosette will be awarded to the next eligible competitor.

Class 3

SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS d'ÉLÉGANCE •

The Judge must be on the current S.S.A. or any appropriate Judging panel but may be assisted by a Celebrity or Sponsor • Where these classes are a main ring attraction Shows may, at their discretion limit entries to Adult competitors only and the rosette provided for the highest placed Junior will not be awarded. The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. 4 Special rosettes will be awarded to the highest placed Adult Members wearing a silk hat, bowler hat, safety hat and the highest placed Junior Member of the S.S.A. carrying their current Championship Points Cards. N.B. Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults IN THIS CLASS AT ANY TIME OF DAY. Juniors must wear hats to current British Safety standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

Class 4 The Side Saddle Association

♣ CLASSICAL LADIES SIDE SADDLE QUALIFIER **♣**

The Judge must be on the current S.S.A., SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, or P(UK) Judging Panels Open to S.S.A. Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cms (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, P(UK) or SSA Panel Judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. N.B. Silk hats are permitted to be worn in this class AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. Special rosettes are offered by Mrs. C. Marchbank & Dr. K. Milbourne to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, a second rosette is awarded with the Qualification Card. Qualifying combinations are r equired to become Full Members of the S.S.A. 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only. To mark the Side Saddle Association's 40th Anniversary a Celebration Rosette will be awarded to the winner of each Classical Ladies qualifier class held in 2014. Rosette sponsored by Dr. K. Milbourne. ♣The highest placed Small Riding Horse (exceeding 148cm but not exceeding 158cm), Large Riding Horse (exceeding 158cm), Hack (exceeding 148cm but not exceeding 160cm) or Cob (exceeding 148cm), Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, ridden by a S.S.A. Adult Member qualifies for The 2014 BSHA Championship Show iPura Side Saddle Championship and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place. The qualification period is 1st January, 2014 to 13th September, 2014. SSA Members who qualify for The iPura Championship, will not be required to join the BSHA in order to compete in any Side Saddle class at the BSHA National Championship Show. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed at the time of qualification, competitors will not be charged a late entry fee for the iPura Championship.

CLASS 5

SIDE SADDLE RIDING CLUB HORSE/PONY OPEN CLASS

The Judge must be on the current S.S.A. or other appropriate Judging Panels Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over. Riders will be required to give a short show including a small jump, maximum 61cms (2'). The height may be adjusted during the course of the class at the Judge's discretion. The class shall be judged on the show, the manners of horse/pony and its suitability for the rider. Conformation will not be considered. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the S.S.A. carrying their current Championship Points Cards. Hats to current British Safety standards or above must be worn for this class.

all in 40 x 20 m

Class 6 Prelim18 (2002)

Class 7 to follow Novice28 (2008)

Class 8 to follow Elementary 50(2007)

Class 9 Medium 63 (2002)/ Adv Medium 90 (2012)

Classes may be amalgamated if insufficient entries

Competition rules

All Classes are run under current SSA rules—see current Handbook

All horses and ponies must be 4 years old or over

The Judges decision is final

All affiliated classes shall be ridden side saddle (others can be ridden astride)

The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry and to alter, amalgamate or cancel classes

There will be no ambulance in attendance although there will be trained First Aiders on the showground

All competitors and those in attendance are reminded of their individual responsibilities with regard to Health & Safety, not only to themselves but others on the show ground. This responsibility extends to safe parking of vehicles and management of horses/ponies

No responsibility will be accepted by SSA Area 14 or The Talland School of Equitation for any accident howsoever it is caused
