Class 1 SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS d'ÉLÉGANCE

The Judge must be on the current SSA or any appropriate Judging panel but may be assisted by a Celebrity or Sponsor

Where these classes are a main ring attraction Shows may, at their discretion limit entries to Adult competitors only and the rosette provided for the highest placed Junior will not be awarded.

The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. 4 Special rosettes will be awarded to the highest placed Adult Members wearing a silk hat, bowler hat, safety hat and the highest placed Junior Member of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. **N.B.** Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults IN THIS CLASS AT ANY TIME OF DAY. Juniors **must** wear hats to current Safety standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

Class 2 - Not before 10.15 The Side Saddle Association EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS

Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. **Southernden Farm** offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. **Side Saddle International** offer a rosette to the Adult Member and **Manor Grange Stud Show Centre** to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out. Juniors must wear Hats to current Safety Standard or above.

Class 3 11.00 approx

BEST RIDING CLUB HORSE/ PONY

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards.

Class 4 the Side Saddle Association 11.45

CLASSICAL LADIES SIDE SADDLE QUALIFIER

□ The Judge must be on the current SSA, SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, or P(UK) Judging Panels

A maximum of 3 per annum for SSA Area run Shows

Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, P(UK) or SSA Panel Judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. N.B. Silk hats are permitted to be worn in this class AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination gualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous gualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. Special rosettes are offered by Mrs. T. Mitchell to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, a second rosette is awarded with the Qualification Card. Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the gualification, for that year only. The highest placed Riding Horse, Hack (not exceeding 160cm), Cob or Hunter, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, ridden by a SSA Adult Member gualifies for the current year's BSHA Championship Show Total Impact Equestrian Ladies Show Horse Championship and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5" place. Combinations gualifying after the current year's BSHA Championship Show may carry forward the qualification, to the following year. SSA Members who qualify for The Ladies Show Horse Championship, will not be required to join the BSHA in order to compete in any Side Saddle class at the BSHA National Championship Show. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed at the time of qualification, competitors will not be charged a late entry fee for the Championship.

CLASS 5 SIDE SADDLE COSTUME CONCOURS d'ÉLÉGANCE - Not Before 12.30

The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the judge may ask small groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. 2 Special rosettes to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card. Competitors should produce a brief résumé about their costumes for the Commentator. Juniors **must** wear hats to current Safety Standard or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

CLASS 6 SIDE SADDLE EQUITATION JUMPING CLASSES

□ The Judge must be on the current SSA Judging Panel

 $\hfill\square$ To be run under SSA rules as they appear in the current Members' Handbook

□ Hats to current Safety Standard or above must be worn

□ Junior riders are **not permitted** to wear a spur or spur band in any class where jumping is involved

□ Shows may title their class/(es) at their discretion, i.e. Open, Intermediate, Novice, Junior, Beginners etc., but may not exceed the appropriate heights or spreads stipulated below

□ It is recommended that the first fence is built on the right rein towards the collecting ring

□ The first two fences MUST NOT be at maximum height

Doubles and "Dog Leg" turns MAY NOT be included at any level

Competitors may only compete once in any Equitation Jumping class, but may ride subsequent rounds, the National Side Saddle Show excepted, Hors Concours, on another horse or horses.

Competitors may select at which height they would like to jump within their relevant class.

□ The course shall consist of rustic or coloured fences, or a combination of both, and the number of fences must not exceed those stated.

□ Maximum height and spread of fences: See End

All Tests to be ridden in a 60 x 20 m arena

Class 7: Jr/ Adult Novice Equitation 40 x20

Class 8: Adult Intermediate/ Jr / Ad Open Equitation (60x20)

RULES

The Judges decision is final

All affiliated classes shall be ridden side saddle (others can be ridden astride)

The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry and to alter, amalgamate or cancel classes

There will be no ambulance in attendance although there will be trained First Aiders on the showground

All competitors and those in attendance are reminded of their individual responsibilities with regard to Health & Safety, not only to themselves but others on the show ground. This responsibility extends to safe parking of vehicles and management of horses/ponies

No responsibility will be accepted by SSA Area 14 or The Talland School of Equitation for any accident howsoever it is caused

Side Saddle Competition rules

All Classes are run under current SSA rules—see current Handbook

SSA RULES a few reminders;

FALLS: A fall of horse/pony or rider in any class run under Side Saddle Association rules will result in disqualification, and the rider must leave the ring dismounted. It is strongly recommended that medical advice is then sought before competing in any other class.

JUNIOR MEMBERS: MUST have attained their 5th birthday and wear a hat to current British Safety standards or above, in ALL classes affiliated to or run by the SSA. A Spur or Spur band is not permitted in any class where jumping is involved.

JUNIOR COMPETITORS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS: MUST have attained their 5th birthday and be under 18 on 1st January of the current year and wear a hat to current British Safety standards or above, in ALL classes affiliated to or run by the SSA. A Spur or Spur band is not permitted in any class where jumping is involved.

ADULT MEMBERS: MUST wear a hat to current British Safety Standard or above where indicated in the Class Wording. Where safety hats are not compulsory, Adult competitors wear alternative headgear at their own risk.

ADULT COMPETITORS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS: MUST be aged 18 or over on 1st January of the current year and wear a hat to current British Safety Standard or above where indicated in the Class Wording. Where safety hats are not compulsory, Adult competitors wear alternative headgear at their own risk.

LEAD REIN competitors **MUST** compete **Hors Concours** in any SSA affiliated class unless otherwise stated. **QUALIFIERS:** Shows held up to and including the first day of the 2015 National Side Saddle Show will be Qualifiers for 2016. Shows held after that date will be Qualifiers for the following year.

All horses and ponies must be 4 years old or over

Junior Novice A: Maximum number of fences 8 38 cm (1'3") max height, 30cm (1'0"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 30 cm (1'0") Junior Novice B: Maximum number of fences 8 53 cm (1'9") max height, 38 cm (1'3"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 46 cm (1'6") Junior Open A: Maximum number of fences 8 53 cm (1'9") max height, 38 cm (1'3"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 46 cm (1'6") Junior Open B: Maximum number of fences 8 70 cm (2'3") max height, 46 cm (1'6"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 61 cm (2'0") Adult Novice A: Maximum number of fences 8 70 cm (2'3") max height, 46 cm (1'6"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 61 cm (2'0") Adult Novice B: Maximum number of fences 8 76 cm (2'6") max height, 61 cm (2'0"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 70 cm (2'3") Adult Intermediate A: Maximum number of fences 9 76 cm (2'6") max height, 61 cm (2'0"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 70 cm (2'3") Adult Intermediate B: Maximum number of fences 9 84 cm (2'9") max height, 70 cm (2'3"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 76 cm (2'6") Adult Open A: Maximum number of fences 10 84 cm (2'9") max height, 70 cm (2'3"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 76 cm (2'6") Adult Open B: Maximum number of fences 10 91 cm (3'0") max height, 76 cm (2'6"), max spread, first 2 fences max height 84 cm (2'9")

A Special Rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card.
